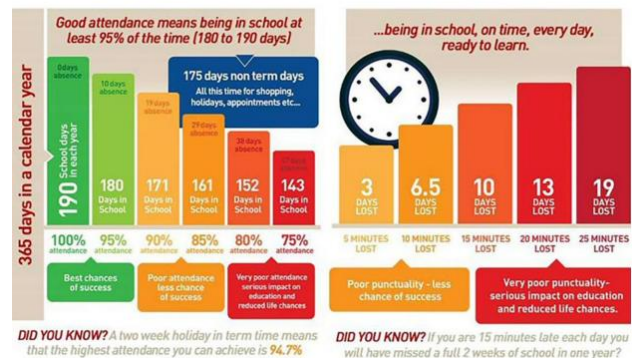
INSET DAY
