
Explain you answer.

Art- Animal track printing

Find a shape that you can use to print some nice backgrounds.

Wait for it to dry and then create a print from card, sponge,
different objects around the house to represent an animal track like
these below.

Print your animal tracks on top of your printed shape backgrounds to create 2 layers of printing. Choose good colours and you could even create a pattern of colours if you want.



Computing - if you can get online

Create your own Google logo basing the letters on animals. You can then visit this scratch project and animate it.



DT - textiles

Create a stuffed animal.

Choose your favourite animal and draw it on a piece of card. You could use a box from the recycling for this such as a cereal packet.

Draw around the template you have made onto fabric. You could use an old pillow case or t-shirt for this. Do this twice, you will have to turn your template over so that the outside of the fabric is seen on your finished piece.

Join your pieces of fabric together using a running stitch. Follow the tutorial below – if you can get online. If not, use glue or tape or maybe someone in your house can teach you to sew.
