### Colour Walk

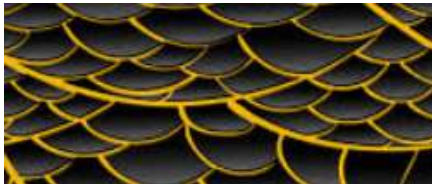
The final poem "Portrait of a Dragon" in the English pack talks about all the colours that a dragon breathes out.

In pictures dragons often have scales. The ones above are really striking because they use colours that contrast with each other, this means they are not similar.



Opposite colours on this colour wheel would create stunning dragon scales. Try to draw purple scales with a yellow trim or orange scales with a blue trim.
