

Introduction to, and extract from, Dear Teacher by Amy Husband

Dear Teacher, by Amy Husband, is a brightly illustrated collection of letters from Michael, a very imaginative boy, to his teacher. It starts with a letter from Michael's Headteacher which welcomes him back to school and introduces his new teacher, Miss Brooks.



In reply, Michael writes a series of letters to Miss Brooks, **informing** her of his summer **exploits** as a **secret agent**, along with his dog Bruno. The **duo** jet-set around the world, from Mount Everest to Egypt to the Amazon River. They **encounter** pirates, find treasure, and ride motorcycles.

In each letter, he warns Miss Brooks he may not be back in time to start school, but **assures** her that he

is **dreadfully** unhappy about missing his class and home work—especially in maths. On August 29, Michael receives a **response** from Miss Brooks, who is a wise and witty teacher. She **expresses** her **regret** at his missing out on being

football captain, the school trip to the zoo, and class swimming lessons. The final note is a post card from Michael to his parents, hinting at his next adventure.

Extract from the book:

Dear Michael.

We are looking forward to welcoming you back to school for the start of the new year. I hope you have had a really fun break and are ready to dive into lots of learning!

This year your class will be working especially hard in maths, history, geography, and English. I am sure that, if you study carefully, you will find those spelling tests can be a fun challenge!



Your new teacher is called Miss Brooks. She has all sorts of exciting plans for the New Year. We look forward to seeing you on Monday.

In his letters, Michael tells his teacher about all his adventures. If you are listening to the story, how many can you remember? Make a list.




If you are not listening, make a list of the adventures you think he had.

Michael and Bruno go deep sea diving to find the treasure chest, but a giant octopus hides it in his cave.




Michael and Bruno meet some mermaids and mermen who help them get the treasure out of the cave.






